## Music Lessons



## Earth Sciences With Mr Stacy

The year 6 - 8 science students have recently completed a unit on 'Rocks and Mining'. As part of their learning they undertook a practical activity involving mining for chocolate in a chocolate chip cookie.

Students worked in pairs and each student received a 'mine' (chocolate chip cookie) and needed to;

1. Weigh their cookie at the start, (and tailings at the end),
2. Choose and access appropriate mining equipment and;
3. Design the best way of extracting as much chocolate from their cookie as possible with the least loss of chocolate and damage to the 'environment'.

Louise Trinkle and Jimmy Trinkle lost the least amount of chocolate at 0.4g while David Sewruk and Jael Skoczek extracted the most chocolate at 5.0g.

All students were happy at the end of the activity to clean up any left over 'mines'.



## 3-5 Excursion to the Planetarium With Mr Ruediger

On Tuesday Nov 13, the Year 3 – 5 class travelled to the Planetarium at Mawson Lakes as part of their Science unit on the planets of our Solar System. This was an exciting opportunity to 'visit' our planetary neighbours without leaving home.



The Planetarium has a large domed screen which is able to give a close up of many of each of the planet's features.

The presenter also gave an excellent commentary as each planet was shown. She also included the children in her talk.



An extra feature was a video of some of the unusual weather phenomenon found on some planets and moons. She also spoke briefly about what is visible in our night sky at present.

It was a very enjoyable visit with interesting information for the children to add to their class presentations.

We thank our 2 parent drivers, Mrs Ruth Trinkle and Mrs Sara Trinkle for getting us there and back safely. A lunch stop at Civic Park, together with an ice cream and trying out the playground was also enjoyed.


## Rhyme of the dolphin


## The Lost Ruler
