## Media Art Final Projects



## Mobile Science Education

Incursion with the 2-5 students

Last week, David from Mobile Science Education came to teach the grade 2-5 students about matter.

It was an excellent presentation – totally captivating and informative. The presentation involved a series of practical demonstrations – everything from fireballs, to ear-splitting bangs as different states of matter were carefully explored. The children were enthralled, and Mrs George who was supposed to be focusing on her office duties, was totally distracted. She eventually decided there was no point in trying to stay on track and became part of the audience.

The presentation ended 2 hours later in a question and answer time with some of the older students joining in as well.

The students will continue the topic with further learning in Mrs Guzman's science lessons.




## F-2 Science

Lava Lamps

Students conducted an experiment with oil, food colouring, water and a soluble Panadol tablet to conclude if water and oil can be mixed.

Substances such as oil and water which do not dissolve in each other are immiscible. The oil floats on top because it is less dense.

Soluble Panadol tablets contain a mild base which reacts with the acidic Panadol when dissolved together in water to form bubbles of carbon dioxide gas. The chemicals in the soluble tablets do not dissolve and therefore do not react in, vegetable oil. Students were amazed once the tablet was added and the bubbles began to arise.

**Ms Lewis:** " Seven grades and no Foundation year".



**Azayla :** "Were you smacked at school?"
